SHAH WORKED WITH EXTREME REPUBLICANS TO MAKE IT EASIER TO FORCE CONVERSION THERAPY ON YOUNG ARIZONANS

2022: Shah Co-Sponsored A Bill That Would Have Banned Discrimination On The Basis Of Gender Identity Or Sexual Orientation And Banned The Use Of Conversion Therapy On Minors. “A special committee appointed by House Speaker Rusty Bowers, R-Mesa, took several hours of testimony on House Bill 2802 on March 17. [...] Sponsored by Bowers and Rep. Amish Shah, D-Phoenix, the bill would have banned discrimination in employment, housing and public accommodations based on sexual orientation or gender

identity, and banned health care providers from performing conversion therapy on minors. Several major business groups backed the bill, saying it would ensure businesses still want to come to Arizona.” [Arizona Capitol Times, [3/25/22](#)]

The Bill Would Have Exempted Religious Institutions, Parents And Clergy From The Bill’s Anti-Conversion Therapy Provisions. “It would also ban health care providers from performing conversion therapy on minors. Religious institutions such as churches and religious schools would be exempted from the bill, and the anti-conversion therapy provisions would not apply to parents and clergy.” [Arizona Capitol Times, [3/18/22](#)]

SHAH WAS THE ONLY HOUSE DEMOCRAT TO VOTE WITH EXTREME REPUBLICANS TO KICK ELIGIBLE ARIZONANS OFF THE VOTER ROLLS

Shah Was The Only Democrat To Co-Sponsor SB 1638, Which Was A Bill That Sought To Provide An Accessible Vote By United States Mail Option For Persons Who Are Blind Or Have A Visual Impairment.” [SB 1638, [2022](#)]

Rep. Bolding Voiced Concern For SB 1648, Saying The Bill Could, “Kick People Off Of The Rolls.” REP. BOLDING: “I think there are multiple things with this floor amendment, it’s not germane to SB 1638, the other aspect is what we all know and what we have said and there are significant and serious concerns with that HB 2492, which was passed by partisanly here in the House and Senate could potentially kick people off of the rolls. That’s the argument that people could have made. That’s an argument I think we’ll see as this goes into court. But I think this is an attempt to further that conversation...Why do we have a nongermane amendment to this bill? Shah Was The Only Democrat To Vote For The Bill On The House Floor. On April 11, 2022, the House passed SB 1638 by a vote of 32-25-3. Shah was the only Democrat to vote in favor of the bill, which was signed into law by Gov. Doug Ducey. [SB 1638, [4/11/22](#)]

2021: ARIZONA LEGISLATURE PASSED A BILL ALLOWING PHARMACISTS TO DISPENSE CERTAIN KINDS OF HORMONAL BIRTH CONTROL WITHOUT A PRESCRIPTION, OTC

The Bill Allowed Arizona Pharmacists To Dispense Certain Kinds Of Birth Control Without A Prescription, Joining More Than A Dozen Other States That Had Eliminated A Prescription Requirement For Certain Birth Controls. “Women in Arizona may soon find it a lot easier to get to get

birth control. On a 32-24 vote, the House on Monday approved allowing pharmacists to dispense certain kinds of contraceptives without getting a prescription. More to the point, it would eliminate the need to first go to a doctor. SB 1082 would have Arizona join more than a dozen states that already have eliminated the requirement for a prescription.” [KAWC, [6/29/21](#)]

6/28/21: Shah Did Not Vote On The Final Version Of The Over The Counter Birth Control Legislation. On June 28, 2021 Shah did not vote on the final version of SB1082 as amended, which passed the House 33-24 and the Senate 21-8, and was signed into law. SHAH TRIED TO AMEND THE BILL TO LIMIT THE TYPES OF HORMONAL BIRTH CONTROL THAT WOULD BECOME AVAILABLE OVER THE COUNTER

Shah Introduced A Floor Amendment To SB1082 That Would Have Limited Self-Administered Contraceptives To Progesterone Only. “The 4-line Shah floor amendment (6/28/2021 at 1:30 pm) does the following: 1. Limits the self-administered hormonal contraception to progesterone only. 2.
